Garches Gate

Entry and Exit

Private vehicles enter and exit at the gate closest to the town of Garches, where there is also a dedicated gate for pedestrian use.

Student Drop-Off

Signage indicates the drop-off zone along the side of Building 7. Parents should remain in their car when dropping off and proceed to the exit once passengers have stepped out of the car.

Parking

Parents and guests are invited to park in the Garches gate parking lot.

In order to facilitate a smooth traffic flow:

- Ensure your ASP car registration sticker is visible and that your school identification badge is ready to be presented to the guards.
- If you are arranging for visitors to come to campus, please schedule your visits after 9:15 a.m. and before 3:00 p.m. whenever possible.

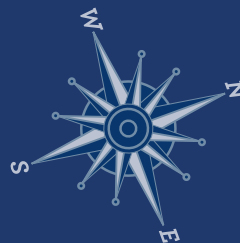

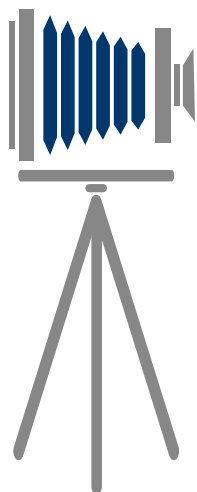
Senior Class Parents

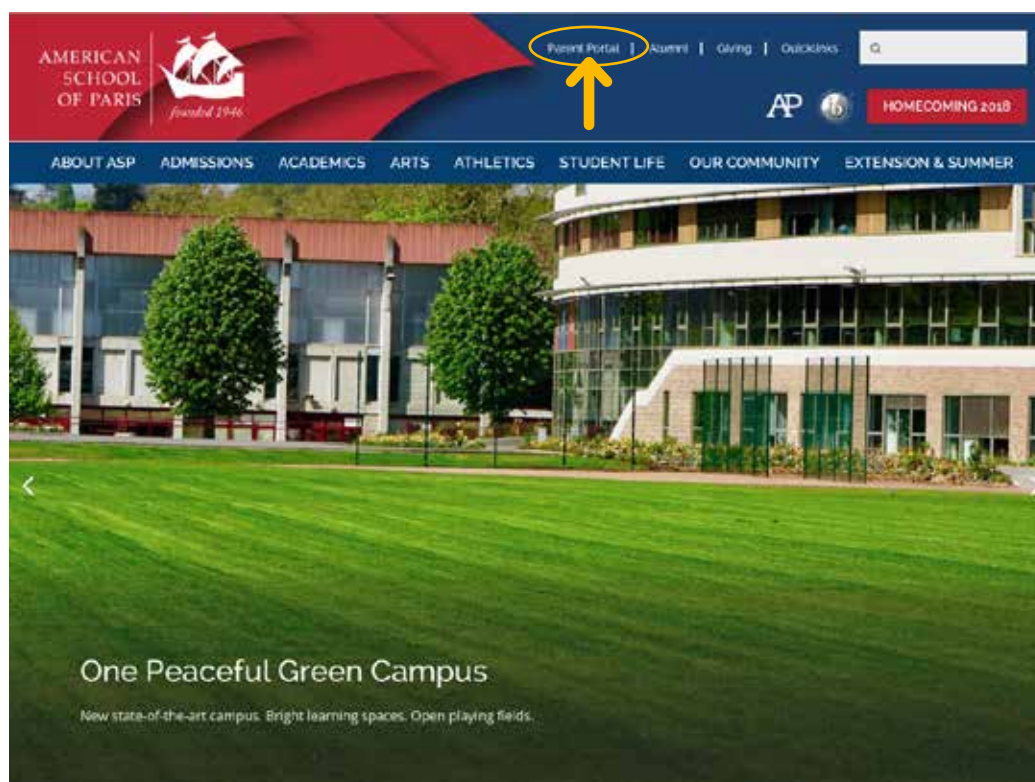

PowerSchool is ASP's student data base. Student schedules, attendance data, grades, and report cards are available here.

Haiku

Haiku is the school's online learning portal. Middle and Upper School teachers use Haiku to extend the classroom environment. For the ASP student, Haiku provides access to a variety of resources and information related to classes, clubs and other activities.

Seesaw

Seesaw is a student-driven digital portfolio used in the Lower School to document and showcase student learning, and for teachers to communicate with parents.

The ASP Libraries

ASP is home to two libraries: **La Bibliothèque** (Early Childhood-Grade 7), and **Sawiris Family Library** (Grades 8-12).

The libraries support students' literary and information needs through a variety of services and resources.

Workshops are also offered to parents on how to efficiently search our library system's online resources and the Internet. The school subscribes to a number of online databases, which are accessible to all members of the community via the ASP website.

Athletics Program

ASP offers a comprehensive range of co-curricular sporting experiences for students in all three academic divisions.

Lower School

The Lower School Athletics Program is divided into three seasons:

Fall and Spring

Soccer, Baseball, and Tennis

Winter

Basketball and Ball Sports

Everyone is welcome to join. The program is on Wednesdays after school for Grades 3-5 and on Saturday mornings for all grades.

Information and registration forms are posted on the Parent Portal approximately two weeks before each season begins.

There is a €10 participation fee per season and a one-time €60 fee for a uniform.



Middle and Upper School

Eligibility

- Students in Grades 8-12 are eligible to try out for the Varsity teams (when cuts have to be made and students' abilities are equally matched, Upper School students will have preference over Grade 8 students).
- Students in Grades 8-11 may try out for the Junior Varsity teams (in Cross Country, Swimming, and Track & Field, Grade 7 students are also eligible).
- Students in Grades 6-8 are eligible for the Middle School teams.

Middle School Athletics Sign-Ups

Details will be announced at the start of the school year. Athletes will take one trip and host one tournament each season. There is a one-time 60€ fee for a uniform.

Grades 2-8

AcroYoga (Grades 2-5) This fun yoga introduction focuses on zen, inner peace, and many cool crafts complementing individual reflection and self-actualization.

Fashion Drawing & Design

Young designers will learn the basics of fashion rendering and illustration, including figure proportions, shading, and style details to create an individual portfolio. A final project includes dressing a 3D model with a variety of materials to create a unique line of clothing.

Ninja Track (Grades 2-5) A fitness program with a variety of sports that combine simple ninja-moves and track and field.

Upper School

A Capella The Trebels is the student-run vocal group. Members are chosen at auditions and the group sings at various school functions.

Art Club Students work on their choice of projects involving diverse materials and supports.

ASpire The ASP student newspaper, covering school-related topics as well as social issues, world events, and human interest stories.

Debate Club Engages students in the art of argument and how to formally engage in a discussion with others on opposing points.

Entrepreneurship Introduces students to the essential skills of entrepreneurship for both profit and non-profit initiatives.

INK Magazine A student-led literary magazine. Its aim is to allow budding writers to explore their talents, imagination, and self-confidence.

Jazz Band A standard big band playing many types of music such as: blues, swing, cool jazz, funk, rock, Latin, and more.

Eight-Day Schedule

Class schedules rotate on an eight-school-day cycle.

ID Cards | Students

Students in Grades 3-12 are issued a school ID card which also serves as a cafeteria, library, and bus card. Younger students who take the bus will also have a card. The card should be kept within easy access at all times.

ID Cards | Parents

Each ASP parent and guardian is issued an ID card which must be shown to security guards upon arrival. Adults are requested to wear their card at all times, ensuring that it is easily visible while on campus.

Replacement of ID Cards

If an ID card is lost or damaged, a new card request must be made on the Parent Portal. There is a €20 charge for a replacement card.

Vehicle ID

Vehicles entering campus must be registered with school security; ASP families can register their vehicle and obtain a vehicle sticker on the Parent Portal.

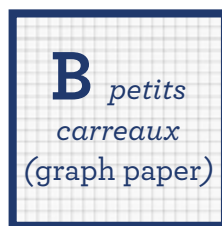
School Supplies

Payment of Tuition and Other Fees

Payment of Tuition Fees and other fees for the 2018-19 school year should be received by ASP as per contract terms for all returning families, and three weeks after invoice issue date for new families. If tuition and fees are paid in total or in part by a third party, it is the parent's responsibility to ensure that payment is made to ASP on time. In the case of students enrolling after the beginning of the school year, payment of tuition fees is due within three weeks of billing. Unpaid tuition fees may result in students being put on a waiting pool or suspended from the school, report cards and transcripts are withheld by the school and, in the case of failure to pay, the account is transferred to a recovery agency. Do not hesitate to contact the Business Office if you have problems paying tuition fees.

Personal Insurance

It is important that your children are covered for their activities related to the school. Your household insurance policy – in French, *assurance multirisques* – may cover incidents involving your child for which you could be held personally liable (*responsabilité civile*). Some policies exclude liability coverage for extra-curricular activities, use of the school facility outside normal school hours, or school-sponsored sporting events. Please double-check to make sure you have adequate insurance coverage before a problem occurs. If your policy is incomplete, your housing is provided by your employer, or if you do not have an *assurance multirisques*, we recommend you purchase a student liability policy. You will find a list of Insurance companies on the US Embassy website under the section **Living in France**.

Health Services

All students are required to provide the school nurse with a current list of vaccinations. Vaccinations must be up to date. Parents should make sure that the B.C.G. vaccination for tuberculosis or the Tuberculin (TB) skin test is valid. Please take care of these vaccinations before school begins.

Accidents or Illness at School

All accidents or illnesses occurring during school hours are reported to the school nurse. If the nurse recommends immediate medical treatment, she will contact the parent or the emergency contact. If there are medical expenses incurred as a result of treatment ordered by the nurse, you must submit the claim to French Social Security, and to your supplementary insurance (*Mutuelle*), or health insurance carrier for reimbursement. The school's insurance policy will intervene only for the portion of the medical expense that remains unpaid after the parent has claimed reimbursement through his medical plan. Thus, if your insurance will not cover the expense, even partially, neither will the school's. Please review your medical coverage to verify coverage for accidents or illnesses that may occur while your child is at school.

Bus Information

ASP offers an extensive private bus system to transport students in the western suburbs and in Paris. Our buses are a reliable and convenient option for getting to and from school.

Communication of any problems/emergencies is done by SMS direct to your French cell phones. Please ensure that we have your numbers and send us any changes that may occur during the school year, and please have your cell phone with you during bus hours.

All Middle and Upper School students should be prepared to show their school ID cards before boarding the bus. Lower School students should have their ID cards in their possession at all times.

Please note that the 5:15 and 6:30 p.m. late afternoon buses have different routes from the regular morning and afternoon buses.

Each bus has a monitor, either an Upper School student or an adult. Do not hesitate to introduce yourself to yours. The tasks of the bus monitor are:

- a) To ensure that all students behave in a safe and sensible manner
- b) To make sure Lower School children are met at the bus stop by a parent or guardian or are accompanied by a Middle or Upper School sibling
- c) To report any unruly or aggressive behavior to the Division Directors or the Admissions Office immediately upon arrival in the morning
- d) To help with new students joining the bus throughout the year
- e) To report any other problems

We are confident that with your cooperation and frequent reminders and discussions at home with your children about the bus rules, we will be able to offer the best bus service possible.

Please don't hesitate to contact us should you have any comments, concerns, or questions.

Q. Can I change to another bus stop on the same route?

Yes, but please inform Brenda Heussaff or Solange della Faille in the Admissions Office before changing stops.

Q. Can I change to another bus?

Please contact Brenda or Solange before switching buses. Some buses, particularly those serving Paris neighborhoods, may be full.

Q. I'm going to take my children to school for the first few days and then I will start putting them on the bus. Do I have to notify anyone about this?

Please notify us 24 hours before your children start using the bus.

Q. Does my child need to show their ID card to board the bus?

Students should carry their school ID card with them and may be required to show them to the driver or monitor.

Q. Can parents ride the bus?

In general, no. Even if it looks like there is room at your stop, consider that other children will be boarding at later stops. Also, if many parents board on days when there are special events at school, that could result in a lack of seats for students.

Q. Who will be helping younger children with their seatbelts?

Upper School students are assigned as monitors on each bus and are responsible for communicating with the driver, reminding students about rules and regulations, and making sure that all children are buckled in. We have also hired adult staff monitors to help on some of the buses.

Q. Can I ask the driver to stop in between two stops or at a former stop?

No. We've mapped out the routes and bus stops based on where students live and a reasonable estimate of how long children should be on the bus. Adding additional stops slows down the commute for everyone and can create a safety hazard.

Q. My Lower School child carries a cell phone and a key to our apartment. Must I meet them at the bus in the afternoon?

All Lower School children must be met by an adult or escorted home by a Middle or Upper School sibling. If you are unable to meet your child at the bus stop, please make arrangements with other parents or older students and inform Brenda or Solange.

Q. What happens if we're running late in the morning? Can we call someone to make sure the bus waits for us?

Please be at the stop five minutes in advance in the morning and in the afternoon when picking up your children. The bus driver may wait for two minutes past the scheduled departure time, but cannot wait longer than that. If you really cannot make it to the bus stop by that time, you will need an alternative plan for getting to school.

Q. Can I get the phone number of the bus driver for my child's bus?

Depending on the needs of the bus companies with which ASP contracts, bus drivers may change. In addition, French law forbids the use of cell phones when driving. If you have concerns, talk to Brenda or Solange. To be prepared for any last minute problems, we also suggest that you exchange phone numbers with other parents at your bus stop or with the bus monitors.

Bus Rules and Regulations

1 All Lower School children should be in the company of an adult or an Upper School student while waiting for the morning bus. In the afternoon, Lower School children should be met by an adult, or accompanied by a Middle School or Upper School student when descending at their stop. In case of an unforeseen problem where the adult is not at the stop to meet the bus, the child must **STAY ON THE BUS AND BE BROUGHT BACK TO THE SCHOOL** after the bus has finished its route to be picked up by the parents at the school.

2 It is forbidden for Lower School students to sit in the first row of seats on the bus. Seating for Lower School students is between the second row and the back exit.

3 The use of objectionable language on the bus is forbidden. Any violation must be reported to the bus monitor immediately or to Brenda Heussaff.

4 In the interest of safety, **ALL** students must be **seated and facing forward** with their **seat belts on** while the bus is moving.

5 **Disruptive behavior can be dangerous! Any violation will be viewed as a serious offense. Repeat offenses will be cause for suspension or expulsion from the school bus.***

6 Once the bus doors are closed in the afternoon, students will not be allowed to board the bus. It is strictly prohibited to run in the parking lot to catch the bus! Students who miss the afternoon bus must check in with the school office and can take a late bus.

7 **Food and drinks are prohibited on the bus. Trash should never be left on the bus. The drivers arrive with a clean bus and the children should leave a clean bus at the end of the route.**

8 ASP is not responsible for items left on the bus; nevertheless, please contact admissions@asparis.fr if your child leaves something on the bus and we will do our best to coordinate with the bus company to find the item. Please label items with your child's name.

9 Enter the bus by the front door only.

10 Please remember that the bus monitor is on the bus to assure that safety and correct behavior are observed. They are to be respected, as you would want them to respect you.

Thank you for taking the time to review the above information with your children. Additional information may be found on the Parent Portal.

*** Any conduct which endangers the safety of students on the bus will result in a phone call and letter to the parents and the student being removed from the bus for a period of one week. All other violations of bus rules will result in a warning letter being sent to the parents outlining the student's behavior. After a second violation of the bus rules, the student will be removed from the bus for one week. Additional violations will result in additional suspension from the bus and additional sanctions until the bus privilege is finally removed permanently.**
